

To borrow a phrase from the 1960's, "We've come a long way, baby!"

The "founding father" of the 95th Bomb Group Memorials Foundation was the 95th Bomb Group Association. The Association was composed only of 95th veterans and wives were usually the



only family members who attended their annual reunions. Fortunately, our veterans had the foresight to envision a future that included the next generation, and beyond. In 1995, the 95th Bomb Group Memorials Foundation lifted off with less than a dozen sons and daughters on board, under the excellent guidance of our seasoned veterans. The following year, President Bob Cozens sent a letter to this small but determined "legacy" contingent which read in part:

"The future of the Foundation is embodied in your willingness to devote your time and effort toward the successful continuation of its mission to educate the public regarding the history of the 95th Bomb Group and its role in the air campaign over central Europe during World War II. I know that it is difficult for the majority of you to take the time away from your family and employment responsibilities to participate. This fact alone makes it doubly meaningful to our generation to recognize that you are willing to make such sacrifices on behalf of our cause. We are most appreciative."

We're 14 years into this mission, and I'm delighted to report that we now number in the hundreds. Not only have we been entrusted with the care and upkeep of our memorials, but also the stories



and relationships that enrich the community we call the 95th Family. It's heartwarming to see new faces at our reunions, with more and more of them being the legacy generation's children and grandchildren. The vitality of our organization will eventually lie in their hands, and it is up to us to make sure they are prepared to accept this extraordinary gift. I'll close with these words from our President Emeritus. **Bob Cozens**:



I was visiting with dad, my hero, **EARL W. EGAN** who is now 87 years old. He proudly showed me the news letter from the 95th Bomb Group. I asked him to detail that time of his life for me, and here is what he said. He was in the 8th Air Force, 3rd Division, 13th Wing, 95th Bomb Group. He proudly flew "Shoo Shoo Baby". On his 3rd mission over Berlin he froze his feet because his heated flight suit failed. He was flying in the position of the ball turret at that time, and he was 6 foot tall if you can imagine. While in the hospital the crew's tail gunner, Gussett was killed. Upon his release from the hospital he assumed the tail position. Dad's crew consisted of BRUCE D. HENDERSON as Pilot, WALPOLE as Co-Pilot, ANDERSON as Navigator, MURRAY KIRSHMAN as Bombardier, MAX LIPHITZ as Top Turret, JOHNSON as Top Turret, JABLONSKI as Waist Gunner, EARL W. EGAN as Ball Turret and Tail Gunner. When MAX LIPSHITZ was killed in a ground

accident his position was taken over by JOHNSON. There was another Waist Gunner but he couldn't remember his name. As I said, "Dad, it's so impressive you could list those names and positions," and he said, "there are just some people you don't forget when you spend that kind of time with them." My dad flew 33 missions and received the Distinguished Flying Cross and Air Medal with 4 clusters. If any of the men that flew with Earl W. Egan on "Shoo Shoo Baby" are still alive please feel free to call him as he is living in Mesa, AZ and his

number is 480.641.9773 I know he'd love to hear from any of his "buddies" I want to thank my dad for instilling in me patriotism. It is because of what he taught me I was able to pass that along to my son who is now serving our country as a B-52 pilot following in his Papa's footsteps. My dad later flew the B-36 and was in a crash when his plane hit a mountain in Goose Bay Labrador, and he was one of the lucky ones that lived to tell that



story also. "PPS (Dad) said to add that his crew's favorite thing to look forward to was when Bert's pub got their rations of beer in, they were the first to enjoy the spirits!!!" Thank you all, **Karen Pommer**— Earl's Daughter

HORHAM TOUR REFLECTIONS "This past year we spent time (traveling).... However, the week we spent in



the tiny hamlet of Horham was most memorable. Horham is perched in the tranquil English countryside of East Anglia where once the mighty 8th AF roared. In the merry month of May, 20 or so octogenarians gathered with kith and kin to attend a 95th BG reunion. There they were welcomed into the hearths, hearts and homes of the townsfolk. We were wined, dined, housed and bused around and about the beautiful rural countryside from manor to castle to

"Co" (Jacobus) de Swart, our Danish Researcher friend, has researched the crash and follow-up of Walter Baker Crew's B-17 "Our Bay Bee." Lt. Col. Henry P. Sarnow, while flying on his eleventh mission, was shot down over German occupied Belgium during a daytime bombing mission. The plane. "Our Bay-Bee," lost engine power after being hit by ground anti-aircraft fire on the morning of August 17, 1943. Dropping helplessly out of



formation, their plane became an easy target for the German fighter planes. Two German fighters attacked and quickly set Our Bay-Bee on fire. The pilot gave the order to bail out! All ten of the crewman made it out of the burning aircraft and parachuted to the ground, seven were quickly captured by German troops. Henry and the badly burned copilot, Marty Kraft, Fighter Pilot Minnich, hid in a canal for nine hours, while German patrols for the downed

flyers. The heroic local people of the **Belgium Underground** risked, and gave, their lives during two fearful months to smuggle these two fliers to their airbase. Co's amazing re-



search includes interviews and photos of the brave Belgium underground from yesterday and today including records, photos, appearance on TV and even interviews with the German fighter pilots who shot down "Our Bay Bee" in '43. We'll post on our website.




The MISSING MAN ceremony..

Subject: President Emeritus' Report

As requested I offer the following as a report from the President Emeritus:

As I look back over the years since the Foundation was established I do so with a feeling of nostalgia, followed by a feeling of remorse realizing that this will be the first annual meeting of the Foundation in which I will not be in attendance.

It was some twenty years ago when, at the request of Dave McKnight, I traveled to Tucson to meet Joe Moller for a personalized tour of the 390th Memorial Museum to discuss the desirability of including a "95th Bomb Group Memorial Room in the then proposed expansion of the Museum.

I left there not only convinced that the 95th should do everything possible to accomplish that goal, but also convinced that the 95th Bomb Group Association should give serious consideration to the formation of a 95th Bomb Group Memorials Foundation.

Sometime thereafter, association president Grif Mumford asked that I chair a committee to study the pros and cons of establishing a 95th Foundation. I submitted a positive report to the Association at the Spokane meeting in 1994 which was approved and an interim committee was established to undertake the formation of the Foundation.

The final steps were taken at the 1995 meeting in San Antonio where the formation of the 95th Bomb Group Memorials Foundation, Inc. was completed. In preparation thereof I had earlier asked Nancy (McKnight) Smith to seek attendance of veteran's children. I don't recall how many were in attendance, perhaps ten or twelve, but I do remember how enthusiastic they seemed to be. It was there where the term "legacy committee" was introduced.

There was a small contingent of Legacy Committee participants at the 1996 meeting in Savannah. In a letter to each of those attendees I included two paragraphs as follows:

"The future of the Foundation is embodied in your willingness to devote your time and effort toward the successful continuation of its mission to educate the public regarding the history of the 95th Bomb Group and its role in the air campaign over central Europe during World War II.

I know that it is difficult for the majority of you to take the time away from your family and employment responsibilities to participate. This fact alone makes it doubly meaningful to our generation to recognize that you are willing to make such sacrifices on behalf of our cause. We are most appreciative."

As you may recall it was only a few short years later when Nancy Smith and Margaret Blagg were elected copresidents of the Foundation. Today the Board of Directors has a majority of "Legacy"

officers and members.

You have done well and are to be commended. We 95th Veterans thank you and wish you well. The years ahead will be challenging as you reach the point of your retirement from the board to make room for the next generation to pick up and carryon the recogni tion of the contributions that our generation made in an effort to protect the freedom of our nation.

We know that you can do it and we expressly thank you most sincerely.






