Report of Operations Officer, Mission of 5 February 1944.

TO : Commanding Officer, 95th Bombardment Group (H), APO 634.

1. GENERAL WARRATIVE. The 95th Bombardment Group took off as the low Group in the 13th Combat Wing formation at 0810-0827 hours. By 0835 the Group formation had assembled over the base at 2000'. The climb to Combat Wing assembly altitude was started at this time, however the 95th Group was able to pick up the lead Group during the climb and climbed in trail with them to altitude. The 95th Group was in good Combat Wing formation at 0915 at 11,500' as the low Group.

Buncher #11 was crossed at 0946 at 16,400' where the 390th Group joined as the high Group. Splasher #7 was crossed at 0958 at 17,300' with all three Groups in good Combat Wing formation. Between Solasher #7 and Splasher #9 a descent of 1500' was made to stay out of clouds at flight altitude. Splasher #9 was crossed at 1019 at 17,200'. Beachy Head was crossed on route out at 1027 at 18,200' with the Combat Wing in good formation.

Landfall was made at 49°57' 01°05'E at 1043 at 21,300'. Bombing altitude was reached at 1053 and later additional altitude was gained to stay above the clouds at flight altitude. Descent later made to bombing altitude and route in to the target on course and uneventful.

The Primary Target was obscured by clouds so Wing Leader called that secondary target would be bombed. Interval was taken without an I.P. for secondary target with bombs away at 1213 at 22,000' on a heading of 341° Magnetic.

1000' was lost after bombs away and Combat Wing formation resumed. Route home was flown as briefed with enemy coast being recrossed at 49°57' 01°10'E at 1250 at 20,000'. Descent was started at this time with the English coast being recrossed at Beachy Head at 1315 at 11,000'.

Combat Wing leader broke Groups off at Beachy Head and 95th Group returned to the base in formation and landed at 1413-1429.

2. AIRCRAFT MOT ATTACKING. Twenty four (24) aircraft including three(3) spares left the base in the attacged Diagram "A". Spare aircrafts #0322 and #7971 returned before becoming dispatched. Thus twenty two (22) aircraft were dispatched.

Of the twenty two (22) aircraft which went over the target three(3) failed to bomb. Aircraft #9869 failed to bomb due to salvo handle sticking and bombardier did not want to drop bombs late in Paris. #9793 and #1675 failed to bomb as these two bombardiers were watching the Squadron lead ship, #9869, and failed to bomb when he did not bomb. The formation over the target is shwon in attached Diagram "B".

3. LOST AIRCRAFT. No aircraft were lost from 95th Group.






95TH GROUP OVER TARGET DIAGRAM "B"




