The briefed course was followed to the I.P Flak was sighted at Mamburg, but did not affect our formation. The Wing reached the I.P., 13 minutes early, due to difference in briefed and actual winds, arriving there at 1316. Fighters were notified at each control point, of the changed times, and were able to rendezvous with the bombers as planned. The 13th Wing turned at the I.P. and the signal was given by the Wing Leader to bomb visually on the secondary target. The 390th Group peeled off first, followed by the 100th and 95th Groups; the three Groups having approximately a 1000 yard interval between them. Dombs were away at 1319 and a sharp right turn was made. The target was covered by 8/10 clouds with a few breaks over the city itself. As the right turn was made, several groups of B-17's coming in from the left, disturbed our Wing's turn and delayed its rally. Rally was finally effected in about 10 minutes.

Wing formation remained good on the way out. At 1329, letdown to 18,000 feet at 200 feet per minute was begun. The formation flew at little north of course on the return, bringing them within range of the Bremem flak. The enemy coast was re-crossed at 1515, altitude 10000' and descent begun at 170 miles per hour, 500 feet per minute. Two-thirds of the way across the English Channel, a hole was signted in the clouds below, and the 15th Wing made a 360° turn descending through this break. Top of the cloud layer was 4,500 feet and bottoms at 2,000 feet. During the descent the 95th Group became separated from the Wing, and so continued to the coast alone. It reached the English Coast at 1615 and base at 1626, landing at 1630-1650.

2. Aircraft Not Attacking: Twenty-three aircraft, including two spares, left base in the formation shown in attached Diagram "A". Spare/a/c # 42-31989 and #42-31992 were not needed and turned back at a point 05°10'N-03'00'E as ordered. Thus twenty one aircraft were dispatched.

All twenty-one aircraft went over the target and returned to base.

3. Lost Aircraft: None.
