SUBJECT: Report of Operations Officer, Mission of 27 March 1944, Cazaux, France.

TO : Commanding Officer, 95th Bomb Group (H), APO 559.

1. GENERAL NARRATIVE: The main 95th Group formation took off at 1000 - 1024 hours to form the lead Group in the 13th Combat Wing formation. Assembly was made at 7500' at Mendleskam buncher above the overcast. By 1045 the main 95th Group had formed and started it's climb to Combat Wing assembly altitude. The 390th "A" and "B" Groups were in sight during the climb and rendezvous made with them as schueled at Splasher # 6. A point six (6) miles southeast of Splasher # 6 was crossed at 1125 at 12000' with the 390th "B" and "A" in high and low Group position respectively. Splasher # 7 was cut short about seven (7) miles at 1138 to enable the 4th Combat Wing to fall into echelon right formation. Splasher # 8 was crossed at 1154 with the 13th and 4th Combat Wings in good formation. Shoreham was crossed on route out at 12072 at 12000'.

Landfall was made at the enemy coast at 49°24' - 01°07'W at 1237. A solid undercast which had persisted up to this time broke off into a very light haze. The briefed route was flown from this point to the target. Fighter rendezvous were made as briefed.

A red flare was fired at the I.P. at 1431 and a good bombing run was had by the 95th main Group with bombs away at 14362. Rally was a little slew as not a sharp enough turn was planned at the Rally Point.

The briefed course was flown back with enemy coast crossed at 49°23' - 00°56'W at 1640 at 12000'. The English coast was crossed at Selsey Bill at 1715 at 10000'. Both 390th Groups were broken off at this point to descend in an area west of London as ordered by 3rd Bomb Division.

The main 95th Group formation returned to base beneath the overcast at 1819 and landed at 1820 - 1849.

2. AIRCRAFT NOT ATTACKING: Twenty three (23) aircraft including two spares assembled in the formation shown in diagram "A". Aircraft # 42-31258 returned as an unused spare. Aircraft # 42-37876 filled in with the 390th "B" Group as # 8 ship in the high squadron.

Of the twenty two (22) aircraft dispatched, all are credited with sorties and all attacked the primary target.

The position of aircraft of the main 95th Group over the target is shown in diagram "B".

95th - 390th "B" Composite Formation

1. GENERAL NARRATIVE: Six (6) aircraft took off at 0920 - 0924 to form the low squadron for the 390th "B" Group formation. Assembly and rendezvous of these six ships with the 390th "B" Group was made over Buncher # 11 at 12000' at 1045. The remainder of the mission was flown in company with the 390th "B" Group and reference is made to the report of the 390th "B" Group for a summary of the remainder of the mission.

There are no additional comments to offer as no difficulty was experienced by the 95th Composite Squadron in formation.

2. AIRCRAFT NOT ATTACKING: Six (6) aircraft of the 95th Group assembled in the formation shown in diagram "A".

All six aircraft were dispatched and are credited with sorties. All six aircraft bombed the primary target in the formation shown in diagram "B".

3. LOST AIRCRAFT: No aircraft were lost from the 95th Composite Squadron.
