HEADQUARTERS NINETY FIFTH BOMBARDMENT GROUP (H) Office of the Operations Officer APO 559 12 April 1944 SUBJECT: Report of Operations Officer, Mission of 10 April 1944. : Commanding Officer, 95th Bomb Group (H). APO 559. 95B GROUP 1. GENERAL NARRATIVE: 16 A/C, including 2 spares of 95B Group took off from base at 0610 - 0622 hours. By 0630 Group assembly had been effected over base at 20001. The 95A Group joined as high Group over base. The low squadron of 6 A/C from 100 Group tacked on over base and both 95A and 95B Groups left base proceeding to Combat Wing assembly line. Leader exchanged flares and the 100 Group joined as low Group to complete Combat Wing assembly. Proceeding to splasher # 6 the wing leader instructed the deputy leader to take the wing lead. Engine trouble forced the wing leader to abort. Arriving at splasher # 6 at 18,000' the climb to 21,000' was begun at 0748 hours. Splasher # 7 was passed five miles left of course and splasher # 8 reached at 0817. 13A Combat Wing left English coast left of Beachy Head and proceeded across channel. Enemy coast was crossed slightly north of course at 0837 at 21,000'. Approaching the target it was observed that an undercast covered the target area. 95B Group leader asked 95A Group to assume the Wing lead - and the new leader made a 1800 turn to the right and proceeded back along course until at 0935 hours, a target of opportunity, Beaumont - Sur - Oise, was sighted and bombing run made. 95A Group bombed this target at 0947 from an altitude of 22,0001. All 21 aircraft dropped their incendiary bombs on this target. The 95B Group lead bombardier, due to the short run, was unable to syncronize on target in time and so with held his bombs, rather than bomb indiscriminately. 14 aircraft were in 95B Group over the target. After rallying - a course was set homeward and the enemy coast recrossed at 1015 hours. Eight minutes later, due to a nose fire in the 95A Leadship 95B Group reassumed the Wing Lead. The English coast was crossed at Dungeness at 1037 hours at 10,000'. Base was reached at 1115 hours. Landing for both Groups was effected between 1125 - 1156 hours. -1-

2. AIRCRAFT NOT ATTACKING: Sixteen aircraft, including two spares, left base in the formation shown in attached diagram "A". A/C No. 42-31376 and A/C No. 42-37894 turned back before being dispatched, and neither is credited with a sortie. No. 42-31376, the Group lead ship, was replaced by the deputy leader and the two spares filled in the vacancies. All fourteen aircraft over the target jettisoned their bombs in the English channel on return. The formation over the target is shown in attached diagram "B". A detailed description of reasons for failure to attack is given in a seperate report on Aircraft Not Attacking. 3. AIRCHAPT LOST: None. 95A GROUP 1. GENERAL NARRATIVE: 21 Aircraft took off at 0540 -0557 hours and assembled over the base. This Group flew high Group for 95B Group - and a narrative of the mission is listed above under the 95B narrative. All 21 aircraft in "A" Group dropped their bombs on the target of opportunity. 2. AIRCRAFT NOT ATTACKING: All 21 aircraft attacked the target and are credited with sorties. A/C No. 42-31258 was lost on the way home. . 3.
