SUBJECT: Report of Operations Officer - Mission of 29 May 1944.

TO: Commanding Officer, 95th Bombardment Group (H),

95 "B" Group Formation

l. GENERAL NARRATIVE: The 95th "B" Group, flying as high Group in the 13th Combat Wing, took off from base at 0745 - 0800 hours, and assembled over field at 2,000' by 0805 hours. Climb to 17,000' was begun and Wing formation, with the 100th Group, lead, and 95th "A" Composite Group, low, was completed at 0910, approximately half-an-hour ahead of schedule.

The Wing contacted all control points, made Division rendezvous at 0949 hours and left the English coast at Great Yarmouth at 1006 hours, two minutes late, at an altitude of of 17,000' for 95 "B".

The enemy coast was crossed at 1040 hours, at an altitude of 21,000', on course and on time - and briefed course to I.P. was maintained. Little flak and no fighters were encountered by 95 "B". Visibility was excellent and no clouds were seen. Wing formation was fairly good all the way in.

The I.P. was reached at 1222, 8 minutes early, interval taken, and run on target made. A heavy smoke screen over target made sighting difficult. Bombs were away at 1232 hours, altitude 26,000', and 95 "B" made sharp left turn, but encountered another Group on bombing run, and so made a steep turn to the right in order to avoid collision. This placed 95 "B" ahead of the 100th lead Group and abreast of the 4th Wing. Gradually, however, 95 "B" dropped back and resumed Wing formation in 13th Wing.

On the route out, let down to 20,000' was begun, and the Division leaders flew approximately 25 miles south of briefed course until quite near Frankfurt, at which point, a correction to due north was made and this course held until briefed route was intersected. Course was resumed, enemy coast recrossed at 1500 hours at 20,000'.

A/C No. 1924 was knocked down by enemy fighters at the I.P.

The remaining five ships bombed the primary target.

3. AIRCRAFT LOST: A/C No. 1924: Hit by fighters at I.P. 4 chutes.
