PROVISIONAL STATEMENT ON DAMLCE.

The end of one of the standard buildings with ramp has been damaged by a near miss, and another building probably damaged. Eleven craters are seen within the target boundary.

Northwest of the target, a number of houses are seen to be still on fire and on the East side of the target several groups of craters are seen with some damage to various small unidentified building and sheds.

PERIOD UNDER REVIEW.

This report covers damage to the target between 1200B hours on 21 DEC 1948 and 1345A hours on 6 OCT 1944, including the attack by aircraft of U.S. 8th AIR FORCE on 6 OCT 1944.

PROVISIONAL STATEMENT ON DAMAGE.

The target is almost wholly obscured by smoke, however considerable damage is seen in the portions where the smoke is less dense. Among the buildings severly damaged are: five workshops, aero-engine test-beds, a large building including workshops and offices, and seven huts in the Worker's Camp.

Numerous incidents of business/residential damage is seen just NE of the target and several of the buildings are still smoking.

B. OPERATIONAL SUMMARY

1. Bomber Attacks

28 combat wings (865 B-17s, 406 B-24s - 1271 a/c) dispatched in three forces against oil refineries, a/c factories, ordnance depots and plants, and on A/F Training School in northern Germany. Support by 16 fighter groups. 1194 a/c dropped 2449.1 tons GP and 574.9 tons IB on 11 primaries and 19 T/Os, including Stralsund and Stade A/F. All wings except one bombed visually. Weather: 1/10 - 4/10 cloud over most targets; 10/10 cloud over Politz and Stettin E/a opposition: severe attack by 35 plus s/a e/a on one wing of Second Force between Nauen and Berlin, Claims: 3-9-5 air. Iosses: 20 a/c (19 B-17s, 1 B-24).

First Force

12 combat wings (447 B-17s) dispatched against Politz Synthetic Oil, Stargard A/F Training School, Neubrandenburg FW-190 Assembly Plant and Stettin Armored Force Vehicle and Motor Transportation Plant. 123 a/c dropped 932.2 tons GP and 151.0 tons IB - total 1074.3 tons - from 19,500-27,000 feet at 1245-1351 hours on three primaries, Stralsund, Kapbeln and two T/Os. All bombing visual. Politz was not attacked due to 10/10 cloud. 36 a/c dropping GP load on Stralsund also attacked Kapbeln with two each - 100 lb. IBs in special experiment. Leaflets dropped on Neubrandenburg, Stralsund and Stargard. Weather: 10/10 cloud over Politz and Stettin; generally CAVU over other targets; 3/10 - 7/10 cloud over bomber route with tops from 3,000 - 5,000 feet. Flak: meager to moderate, inaccurate in target areas. Battle damage: 7 major, 27 minor. E/a opposition: nil. Claims: nil. Losses: one B-17 to AA.

Fighter Support: Four groups (202 P-51s) dispatched. Up 0927-0948 hours, down 1530-1610 hours. 180 sorties. One group strafed anchorages in areas of Stettiner Lake and Great Jasmunder Bay; another group strafed rail traffic south of Husum. E/a opposition: combat with 30 Me-109s and FW-190s near Landsberg. Claims: 3-1-3 air, 3-0-2 t/e ground, 36-0-12 flying boats in water. Losses: 5 P-51s (one to take-off crash, one crash-landing in U.K., three to unknown causes, two of which are believed safe in Brussels).

Aero-Engine Plant, all in Berlin area. 386 a/c dropped 728.3 tons GP and 193.4 tons IB - total 921.7 tons - from 24,600 - 27,300 feet at 1154-1220 hours on all primaries and ten u/i T/Os. Bombing visual; PFF used for navigational aid only. Leaflets dropped over Berlin. Weather: CAVU to 4/10 with slight ground haze over targets. Flak: moderate to intense, very accurate, tracking and barrage fire over Berlin. Battle damage: 53 major, 181 minor. E/a opposition: approximately 5Q-75 Me-109s and FW-190s sighted in Nauen - Berlin area; 35 of these e/a attacked last combat wing between IP and target. Claims: 3-9-5 air. Losses: 18 B-17s (11 to E/A, 3 to AA, 2 to E/A and AA, 1 Category "E", 1 to unknown causes).

Fighter Support: Eight groups (414 P-51s) dispatched. Up 0858-0929 hours, down 1411-1450 hours. 363 sorties. E/a opposition: five groups had combats with 50 - 75 s/e e/a attacking bombers between Nauen and Berlin; one group also destroyed an Me-410 near Norderney Island. Third Force

Five combat wings (406 B-24s) dispatched against two oil refineries, an aero-engine works, an ordnance depot and jet plane assembly plant in Hamburg area. 376 a/c dropped 797.5 tons G.P. and 230.5 tons I.B. - total 1028.0 tons - from 20,000 - 27,400 feet at 1145-1220 hours on all four primaries, Stade A/F and four T/Os. All visual bombing except oil refinery which was attacked by PFF. Leaflets dropped over Hamburg. Weather: 1/10 - 3/10 cloud over targets; smoke screen at target caused one wing to make PFF run. Flak: moderate to intense; fairly accurate over target area; 12-20 ground rockets also reported; meager, inaccurate at Stade A/F; nil at Wenzendorf. Battle damage: 7 major, 122 minor. E/a opposition: 6 Me-109s reported seen along bomber route but no attacks. Claims: nil. Losses: one B-24 to AA.

Fighter Support: Four groups (168 P-47s) dispatched. Up 0913-0936 hours, down 1405-1433 hours. 156 sorties. Three groups strafed Hamburg and Diepholz areas and shipping at Alte Mellum Island. E/a opposition: one Me-262 destroyed over Rheine A/F. Claims: 1-0-0 air. Losses: nil.

2. Fighter Escort

16 groups (616 P-51s, 168 P-47s - 784 a/c) dispatched to support bombers attacking targets in Germany. Up 0858-0948 hours, down 1405-1610 hours. 699 sorties. Five groups strafed in Baltic area NW of Stettin, Hamburg and Diepholz areas south of Husum and shipping at Alto Mellum Island. E/a opposition: one group had combat with 30 Me-109s and FW-190s near Landsberg; five groups had various encounters with 50-75 s/e e/a attacking bombers between Nauen and Berlin; one Me-410 destroyed near Norderney Island; one Me-262 destroyed over Rheine A/F, Claims:19-1-8 air, 3-0-2 ground, 36-0-12 water. Losses: 10 P-51s (8 to unknown cruses, 1 to take-off crash, 1 crash-landed in U.K.). Strafing claims include: 15 locos destroyed; 3 locos, 1 auxiliary boat, 1 heavy flak position damaged.

5. Photo Reconnissance

12 a/c (8 F-5s, 4 Spitfires) dispatched on photo recommaissance; 9 a/c photographed areas in Germany and eastern Holland; 2 a/c mapped the Scheldt area. One a/c was unsuccessful due to enemy interception. Losses: nil.

6. Weather Reconnaissance

40 a/c (29 P-51s, 3 B-24s, 8 Mosquitoes) dispatched on weather reconnaissance: the P-51s (four aborting) were bomber scouts; 2 B-24s did weather

reconnaissance over water; one B-24 flew routine weather mission over NW England; one Mosquito was on light weather reconnaissance over Germany; and 7 Mosquitoes were assigned to night photography over Holland, Belgium and Luxembourg areas. Losses: nil.

7. Air/Sea Rescue

16 P-47s dispatched on air/sea rescue, flying 44 hours. Two incidents occurred. Lifeboat successfully dropped to one bomber crew; rescue pending. No rescues made from second bomber. Losses: nil.

8. Special Operations

44 a/c dispatched on special operations as follows:

27 a/c (20 P-51s, 6 P-47s, 1 B-17) on radio relays. Two of these P-51s escorted the B-17.

7 B-24s dispatched on RCM, jamming from 1815-2145 hours.
10 a/c dispatched to drop leaflets over Holland, France and Germany.
Two a/c failed to attack due to mechanical trouble.
Losses: nil.

C. INTELLIGENCE

1. Enemy Air Opposition

Today's bomber attacks under favorable weather conditions on multiple targets in northern Germany were opposed by the G.A.F. only in the Berlin area. Approximately 50 to 75 Me-109s and FW-190s were sighted between the IP and the target and 35 e/a made aggressive attacks upon the last combat wing of the Second Force at 1210 - 1215 hours. Initiating their attacks on the high squadron, which lagged behind on a wide turn at the IP, the e/a came in from the tail, level to high, in several waves of four to five abreast. They destroyed the entire squadron, breaking away after the onslaught, while other e/a attacked the other two squadrons individually from the tail. Attacks were very aggressive and closely pressed. The bombers claimed 3-9-5 for a loss of eleven to e/a.

Supporting fighters rushed to the rescue and five groups had various encounters with the evading e/a, claiming 14-0-5 without loss. One group also destroyed an Me-410 near Nordermy Island at 1100 hours.

First and Third Forces were unmolested. Six Me-109s were observed along the bomber route but made no attacks. Fighters supporting the First Force chased 30 Me-109s and FW-190s from Schonefeld at 1315 hours south to Landsberg. Running encounters near Chobience in Poland resulted in claims of 3-1-3 without loss.

A P-47 group supporting the Third Force encountered an Me-262 and an He-280 over Rheine A/F at 1300 hours at 3,500 feet. One P-47 pulled in behind jet a/c, which was heading across the A/F. Two light tan chutes, fully opened, came from the Me-262. E/a orbitted to left in an effort to approach runway strip. P-47 followed, using water injection, and shot several bursts without observing strikes. A moment after last burst, two small objects were seen to break away from e/a surrounded by either a hazy white smoke or spray. P-47

then lost sight of e/a. During entire engagement an He-280 was observed on P-47's tail. P-47 flew approximately 300 IAS and the Me-262 pulled away slightly. It appeared that e/a had a slightly higher wing than shown in drawings. E/a's turn was shallow and P-47 could turn inside.

Uncharted A/F at .5347N-0951E.

Several types of E/a on Doberitz A/F.

15 s/e e/a and three t/e e/a on Nordholz A/F, 5346N-0840E.

18 s/e seaplanes seen taxiing in Stettinger Haven.

15 - 18 gasoline storage tanks at 5337N-0932E.

Nine underground oil tanks at Cuxhaven.

Long clear strip in woods about 10 miles long and 300 yards wide with railroad spur entering woods near area, and two tunnels or caves running north and south; six buildings in the center.

Oil storage tanks and possible loading depot at 5333N-0943E.

Large supply depot with many barracks and 75 - 100 trucks at 5255N-1005E.

Possible large army camp at 5325N-0908E.

Large factory at 5330N-0900E. 18 oil storage tanks at 5345N-0933E.

Structure resembling rocket launching site at 5338N-0900E.

Possible buzz bomb installation in wooded area near Spegerterg, 5336N-1011

4. Damage to Enemy Installations

Berlin/Spandau Ordnance Depot - Good Results.

Target bombed by two combat wings carrying 260 Frags., 500 GP, and 500 IB bombs. Three GP patterns and one IB seen blanketing target area. Two Frag patterns extend into it. Possibly 1/3 of bombs are in target and the balance blanket surrounding surburban area.

Berlin/Spandau Aero-Engine Works - Very Good Results.

Target bombed by four combat wings using 1000 GP and 100 IB: Six patterns of 1000 GP and three patterns of 100 IB blanket target and most of the adjoining factories north of the railroad yards. Ten hits noted on important buildings in target area but smoke from fires prevents accurate estimate of damage. One pattern of 100 IB fell six miles short in a suburban area.

Berlin/Tegel Tank Plant - Good Results.

Target bombed by three combat wings using 1000 GP and 500 IB bombs. Most of 1000 GP fell on target area. One pattern of 1000 GP was 2½ miles west. Three patterns of 500 IB were unobserved. One pattern of 1000 GP blankets area immediately south of plant. At least six hits noted on main buildings.

Berlin/Spandau Gun Park - Fair Results.

Target attacked by two combat wings carrying 500 GP and IB bombs. One pattern of 500 GP blankets northeast corner of plant and surrounding buildings. What appears to be a small explosion is seen in large buildings immediately northeast of depot. Other patterns seen at varying distances from three miles west to four miles east of the target, landing mostly in surburban districts.

Stargard A/F Training School - Very Good Results.

Damage severe. Main repair hangar, at least four direct hits and one fire late in attack. Six of seven medium-sized hangars hit, fires in two of them. Station control building and two small workshops received direct hits. Two buildings in motor transport yard, each of them at least 50 percent destroyed. Wireless station, two probable direct hits; twelve buildings in barracks area, direct hits; one small unidentified building adjacent to motor transport yard, direct hits and an explosion with a fire burning late in the attack; 22 a/c on field at time of attack, at least ten of which are severely damaged or destroyed.

Neubrandenburg FW-190 Assembly Plant - Good Results.

Four concentrations of explosive bombs and two of IB in target area. Heavy smoke in barracks area makes it impossible to pin-point strikes. Of the four remaining hangars on this field, three received direct hits and will be damaged. Three small unidentified buildings received direct hits. 21 a/c on field at time of attack, two severely damaged or destroyed.

Stettin AFV & MT Plant - Fair Results.

12 a/c attacked the Tomnershe/Motorenbau dropping IBs. Photography shows only start of IB across south side of target. Some damage expected since this concentration appears well placed.

Stralsund - Good Results.

Il concentrations GP and RDX (explosive bombs), one concentration of IB in Stralsund area. On the Thermo Electric Power Station, direct hits seen on the border house and on the turbine house. Switch house received a probable direct hit. Damage to the town will be extremely severe in the Franken district. Large fires have been started and photos taken late in the attack show large portion of this section almost completely destroyed. One unidentified factory east of M/Y could be seen burning. The main building of the Wasserflughasen, west of the Stralsund Bridge, at least three direct hits. At least two direct hits on the bridge and a 450 foot vessel received a direct hit. Several small bridges will be damaged.

Hamburg Ordnance Depot/Glinde - Excellent Results.

Target heavily hit by nine squadrons. Patterns of GP seen to cover both MPIs; damage is believed to be very severe.

Glockner Aero-Engine Works - Hamburg - Very Good Results.

Target attacked by 13 squadrons. Cloud obscured results of two squadrons, but target is seen to be heavily hit by patterns of GP and near-misses and hits by M-17s. Fires seen burning and damage is believed to be severe.

Wenzendorf - Hamburg - Very Good Results,

All three MPIs on this target are well-covered, GP bursts and concentrated patterns of IBs seen to start heavy fires. All main facilities well hit and damage is again severe.

Stade A/F - Good Results.

Target hit by two squadrons. A heavy pattern of IBs and a string of GPs burst on main facilities and across landing ground and hangars.

Rhenania Oil Refinery - Poor Results,

No evidence of hits. This target was not hit due to cloud cover at the target. PFF bombing was inaccurate and bursts observed through cloud or a heavy smoke screen to west of the target.

SUBJECT: Report of Operations Officer on Mission of 6 October 1944, Berlin, Germany.

TO : Commanding Officer, 95th Bomb Group (A).

96A GROUP FORMATION

1. GENERAL MARRATIVE: The 95A group, leading the 15B combat wing, took off at 0750 - 0740 hours and assembled above the field at 0835 hours. Wing rendezvous was made above the field at 10,000° at 0840 hours. The flight plan was flown as briefed. We made division assembly at Sp. #6 at 10,000° at 0853 hours. The coast out was crossed at 0906 at 10,000° at Great Yarmouth. The enemy coast was crossed in at 1067 hours, 5446H - 0832E, at 24,000°. The IP was reached at 1152 hours and bombs were away at 1159 at an altitude of 26,000°.

The enemy coast out was made good at 1308 hours at 23,000°. We crossed the English coast in at 1435 hours at 2,000°. Landing was made at 1442 - 1456 hours.

- 2. AIRCHAFT NOT ATTACKING: Ten A/C, including two FFF, were dispatched as shown in Diagram A. Ten A/C attacked the target as shown in Diagram IA. All ten A/C were given credit for sortice.
 - 3. AIRCRAFT LOST: None.

95B GROUP FORMATION

- 1. GENERAL MARRATIVE: The 95B group was flying high on 95A in the 13B combat wing. Takeoff was at 0720 0730 hours and assembly over the field was made at 0825 hours at 11,000°. This group joined 95A over the field at 0835 at 11,000°. The 95B general narrative is the same as 95A with the following exceptions.
 - a. Bombs were away at 1156 hours at 27,000.
 - b. Landing was made at 1500 1515 hours.
- 2. AIRCRAFT NOT ATTACKING: Twelve A/C and one PFF were dispatched as shown in Diagram B. Twelve A/C were over the target as shown in Diagram 1B. All twelve A/C were given credit for sorties.
