#### (ii) DETAILS OF THE ATTACK:

- (a) All photographs received are either partially or completely cloud obscured making plotting of all the bursts impossible. In addition an efficient smoke screen is in operation and at no time during the attack is the target area visible.
- (b) Bursts are visible in areas other than the target as follows:
  - (1) At least 120 H.E. are seen in open fields near the village of QUEIS, 6-1/2 miles East of HALLE.
  - (2) Approximately 35 H.E. are scattered in open fields 6 miles South-Southeast of the snythetic oil plant at MERSEBURG.
  - (3) At least 75 H.E. are seen scattered in open fields 2 miles Southeast of the oil plant. A possible hit is seen on a small rail bridge in this area.
  - (4) Eight are seen scattered in open fields 3 miles East of the oil plant.
  - (5) Four are seen in open fields 4 miles East-Southeast of the oil plant.
  - (6) At least 60 are seen in open fields and on the autobahn near the town of REIDEBURG, 4-1/2 miles East of HALLE. Three probable hits are seen on the autobahn.
  - (7) At least 30 are scattered in the open fields 3-1/2 miles East of HALLE.
  - Six are seen near a rail line 3 miles South-Southeast of the oil plant.
  - Fifty are seen in open fields bordering a railroad 2-1/3 miles Southeast of LELITZSCH, which is 19-1/2 miles Northeast of MERSEBURG.
  - (10)Ten H.E. are seen in fields 4-3/4 miles Southwest of the LEIPZIG passenger station. Other scattered bursts are visible 2000 yards Southwest of this point.
  - (11)Thirty-five are seen in fields 7 miles Northwest of the oil plant.
  - Six are seen in open areas 3-1/2 miles South-Southwest of BRUNSWICK.
  - A concentration of at least 75 is seen in open areas which are (13)unplotted.
  - Bombs are soon falling in a Southeasterly direction over the (14)Eastern part of LEIPZIG. Bursts are unplottable because of cloud cover:

This report deals with damage to the target between 1130 B hrs on 14 827 1944 and 1322 A hours on 14 NOV 1944. This includes the attacks by almoratt of U.S. 8th ATR FORCE on 28 SEP (Sa 2767), 7 OCT (SA 2311), 2 NOV (SA 2889) and 8 NOV (SA 2908)

#### PROVISIONAL STATEMENT OF DALAGE

Due to the poor quality of the cover it is impossible to give a complete assessment. Some damage however is visible scattered throughout the plant.

A water gas plant appears to have moderate roof damage, 40% of the remaining roof of a contact oven house has been destroyed, and a compressor house has scattered roof damage. Three gas holders appear to have been collapsed, and two boiler houses have slight roof damage. In addition, an Absorption House has been hit at one end, and Ammonium Sulfate Silo has approximately 1/6 of roof destroyed, and an unidentified shed has been denolished.

- L. Large Gas holder: appears collapsed.
- 2. 2 small gasholders: appear collapsed.
- 3. Water Gas Plant: moderate roof damage.
- 4. Contact Oven House: 40% of remaining roof destroyed.
- 5. 2 Boiler Houses: slight roof damage.
- 6. Compressor House: scattered roof damage.
- 7. Ammonium Sulfate Silo: 1/6 of roof destroyed.
- 8. Ammonia Absorption House: roof damaged at one end.
- 9. Unidentified Shed: destroyed.

#### 95 A Squadron Formation

- 1. GENERAL NARRATIVE: The 95 A Squadron formation. flying as lead squadron of 18 A Combat Group, took off at 0814 -0824 hours. Assembly was effected over the base at 10,000' by 0900, and the wo high and low squadrons took their positions prior to departure from the base. Wing assembly was made over Hadleigh at 0945 hours, and the Group entered division assembly over buncher 12 at 0950 hours. The coast was crossed over Orfordness at 1006 at 10,000° and climb to bombing altitude was started. The enemy coast was crossed on course at 1054 hours at 17.300'. Shortly afterward the 13th Combat Groups increased airspeed by five miles per hour, following the policy of preceding groups which were attempting to close their gap. The course to the I.P. was flown as briefed; though navigation was largely PFP because of undercast and haze. The I.F. was crossed at 27,000' at 1212 hours, and the formation climbed an additional 800' en route to the target in order to avoid cloud interference. Bombs were dropped in group formation on the PFF flere markers at 1221 hours, and after a right turn the rally point was reached at 1226 hours. At this point the lead PFF equipment failed, and the high squadron deputy leader took over. The route home was flown as briefed, and the formation arrived at the base at 1511 hours, landing at 1525 - 1534 hours.
- 2. AIRCRAFT NOT ATTACKING: Twelve aircraft, including one PFF leader were disputched as shown in diagram "A". All twelve aircraft were over the target and received sorties.
- 3. LOST ATROPART: No. 42-102679 Crippled by flak over target; last heard from on route out at 12,000 feet, with one (1) feathered and another engine on fire.

l. GENERAL NARRATIVE: The 95 B Squadron, flying as high squadron, of the 13 A Combat Group, took off at 0800 - 0812 hours. Assembly was made over the base at 11,000 feet, The squadron took it's position in the group formation at 0910 hours Reference is made to the above report of the 95 A Squadron Formation for the remainder of the mission. In addition, however, the following points are to be noted.

(a) Bombs were away at 1220 hours on a true heading of 130° at an altitude of 26,5000 feet.

(b) At 1254 hours, 51°52'N, 10°25'E, and at an altitude 26,000 feet, on the return route, the 95 B Squadron took over the lead of the Group. The route out was flown slightly to the north of briefed course until the position at 52°12'N - 08°38'E was reached, and from there the briefed course was followed. The Enemy coast was crossed at 1418 hours and at an altitude of 21,000 feet. The English coast was crossed on briefed course at 1456 hours and an altitude of 6,000 feet. The base was reached at 1507 hours, and the formation landed at 1513-1533 hours.

- 2. AIRCHAFT NOT ATTACHTEG: Twelve aircrafte plus one if lead were dispatched as shown in Diagram "B". One (1) A/C ho. 2447, aborted from the formati n after crossing the anemy coast, and is credited with a sortie. The remaining twelve aircraft were over the secondary target as shown in Diagram "lo" and are credited with sorties.

1. GENERAL NARRATIVE: The 95 C Squadren formation, flying as low squadron in the 13 A Combat Group, took off at 0830-0842 hours. Assembly was made over the base at 9,000 feet, The 95 C Squadron took it's position in the Group formation at the same altitude while circling the base at 0950 hours.



#### B. OPERATIONAL SUMMARY

### 1. Bomber Attacks

Thirty combat wings (814 B-17s, 354 B-24s - 1168 a/c) dispatched in five forces against synthetic oil plants at Merseburg/Leuna, Castrop-Rauxel, Sterkrade (Holten) and Bielefeld/Schildesche RR and M/Y. Four assigned targets. 1100 a/c dropped 2652.1 tons on all primaries and several T/Os. All bombing by PFF except force on Bielefeld. Heavy opposition met by two forces in Merseburg target area. Escorting fighters attacked by approximately 500 s/e e/a plus 15 Me-163s. Bomber claims: 36-35-27. Losses: 40 a/c (39 B-17s, 1 B-24).

xx In addition to above statistics, one group Ninth A.F. P-38s flew general area support. 34 dispatched - 31 sorties. No claims. No losses.

#### First Force

Twelve combat wings (460 B-17s) dispatched against Merseburg/Leuna Synthetic Oil Plant. 436 a/c dropped 1029.7 tons GP on primary and 8 T/Os at 1203-1238 hours from 23,800-28,500 feet. Primary bombed on PFF. Leaflets dropped on Merseburg. Weather: 6/10-9/10 en route, 10/10 over target. Flak: intense and very accurate. Battle Damage: 252 minor, 87 major. E/A Opposition: strong enemy effort curbed by escorting fighters. No e/a sighted prior to arrival at IP. Attacks on stragglers by 10 FW-190s and 5 Me-109s. Approximately 9 Me-163s made single attacks on one group. Claims against Me-163s, 2-1-1. Total Claims: 6-2-2. Losses: 12 a/c (7 to AA, 1 to non-enemy, and 4 to unknown reasons).

Fighter Support: Eight groups (483 P-51s) dispatched. Up 0930-1012 hours, down 1500-1530 hours. 433 sorties. One additional group of Ninth Air Force P-38s provided general area support (figures not included in above statistics - 34 P-38s dispatched, 31 sorties. No claims or losses). E/A Opposition: strong enemy defensive effort met in target area by approximately 200 e/a. Breakdown of opposition encountered by individual groups as follows:

- Group 1 15 plus Me-163s and 4 plus Me-109s encountered S and E of Merseburg. 2 Me-163s and 2 Me-109s destroyed in combats. One Me-163 came through bomber formation in target area and was caught by group leader on making 180 degree turn. Other Me-163 destroyed in similar manner near Leipzig.
- Group 2 Approximately 20 FW-190s and Me-109s encountered W of Naumburg (S of Merseburg) attacking rear combat wings. Majority of e/a evaded in overcast. Claims: 1-2-2.
- Group 3 15 plus Me-109s and FW-190s dived through last combat wing in Mulhausen area (approximately 65 miles W of Merseburg). 9-0-0 claims in combats to deck.
- Group 4 100 s/e e/a sighted in gaggles of approximately 30 plus a/c each on SW course from Merseburg. Lead flights routed force, breaking it into elements of 2, 3 and 4 a/c. Claims: 18-1-2.
- Group 5 12 Me-109's sighted S of Merseburg. 2 e/a engaged to deck for claims of 1-0-1.
- Group 6 6 Me-109s and 2 FW-190s attacking bombers in vicinity of Mulhausen engaged for claims of 1-0-0. Two jet-propelled a/c seen N of Zeitz and vicinity of Einbeck.
- Group 7 Trailing flight attacked 6 Me-109s making pass on bombers NW of Merseburg for claims of 1-0-1. 25 plus Me-109s engaged W of Naumburg after e/a had completed pass at bombers. 7 e/a destroyed. 4 jet-propelled a/a encountered before target but e/a evaded.
- Group 8 20 Me-109s from vicinity of Leipzig attacked bombers S of target.

  Group claims 3-0-4. One lone FW-190 destroyed on deck NW of target.

  6 Me-163s seen in Naumburg area, evading due to high speed.

In ground strafing attacks three groups made claims of 0-0-3 gliders. 7-0-2 locomotives and 1-0-36 freight ears. Another group strafed A/F believed to be Wernigrode A/F claiming 25 s/e e/a destroyed on the ground. Total claims: 46-3-10 air, 25-0-0 ground. Losses: 15 P-51s (at least 3 a/e are believed safely flown in Belgium).

#### Second Force

Six combat wings (223 B-17s) dispatched against Merseburg/Leuna Synthetic Oil Plant. 215 a/c dropped 478.5 tons GP on primary and 3 T/Os at 1230-1243 hours from 26,800-29,000 feet. Leaflets dropped on Merseburg. All bombing on PFF. Weather: 7/10-10/10 over most of the Continent; 10/10 at target. Flak: moderate to intense and accurate at Merseburg. Battle Damage: 95 minor, 57 major. E/A Opposition: severe opposition encountered in target area. Four groups attacked by approximately 155 e/a, principally FW-190s and Me-109s including a few Me-163s. E/a made both frontal assaults and concentrated against stragglers. Claims: 30-33-25. Losses: 26 B-17s. (14 to e/a, 5 to AA, 1 to non-enemy, and 6 to unknown reasons).

Fighter Support: Four groups (245 P-51s) dispatched. Up 1007-1015 hours, down 1520-1635 hours. 209 sorties. E/A Opposition: heaviest opposition of operation sustained by this force. Breakdown by groups as follows:

Five combat wings (208 B-24s) dispatched against Bielefeld/Schildesche RR viaduct and M/Y. 191 a/c dropped 399.8 tons GP and 38.5 tons IB - 438.3 tons on the primaries and Bielefeld City at 1221-1242 hours from 20,000-24,000 feet. Leaflets dropped on Bielefeld. Weather: 3/10-4/10 undercast permitted some groups to bomb visually, others on Gee-H. Flak: Nil to meager, inaccurate. Battle Damage: 17 minor. #### 5. Photo Reconnaissance

#### 6. Weather Reconnaissance

42 a/c (33 P-51s, 4 B-24s and 5 Mosquitoes) dispatched. P-51s scouted weather for bomber forces. Two early roturns. All a/c returned safely. One B-24, dispatched from Azores, completed routine flight to home base, two B-24s completed flights over Atlantic to west of England. One B-24, overdue on routine flight to Azores. Mosquitoes completed special flights to Germany, Holland, Belgium and North Sea. Losses: one a/c (missing).

## C. INTELLIGENCE

#### 1. Enemy Air Opposition

Strong enemy opposition was experienced by the 1st and 2nd Forces in today's bombing operation against Merseburg/Leuna Synthetic Oil Plant. Escorting fighters encountered approximately 500 s/e e/a plus at least 15 Me-163s, all of which attempted to intercept bombers in the Merseburg target area. The other forces on shallower targets were negligibly or not at all opposed.

Of the 1st Force escort, the 55th Fighter Group met the only large formation of e/a approximate y 100, flying toward the bombers in three gaggles of 30 plus each at 32,000 feet, southeast of Merseburg. These were dispersed and attack on the bombers prevented. The 4th Fighter Group, sweeping on a wide front ahead

of the hombers, encountered only 15 Me-163s in the target area which were also broken up. Other escort groups report engagements with two smaller e/a formations. 20 - 25 each shortly after the target.

The 2nd Force was more heavily opposed beginning with an engagement by the 352nd Fighter Group, north and east of Merseburg with two waves of 50 e/a each. The 364th Fighter Group at the same time, also encountered two waves of 50 e/a each in the target eare and the 20th Fighter Group engaged the largest single concentration of e/a, 150 - 200, just south of Merseburg while they were attacking the rear bomber formation. This is the only engagement reported by the bombers when 40 - 60 e/a were able to make coordinated attacks lasting for 10 - 15 minutes.

Penetration and withdrawal routes were uneventful for both forces.

#### 4. Damage to Enemy Installations

### Merseburg/Leune - Unobserved Results

Dense undercast and effective smoke screen in operation at the target make it impossible to plot the main weight of bombs dropped. However, the following concentrations could be seen: (1) one concentration of GP bombs fell in open field bursting approximately  $2\frac{1}{4}$  miles southeast of the target. (2) Two concentrations of GP bombs fell into open field northeast of the town and in Klepzig, located  $6\frac{1}{2}$  miles east of Halle and  $12\frac{1}{2}$  miles northeast of Merseburg.

Combat crews of last group over the target reported smoke and flames through 14.000 feet of clouds.

### Sterkrade (synthetic oil plant) - Unobserved Results

9/10 to 10/10 cloud cover covers entire area. Through one break in the clouds it is possible to see a small concentration of GP bombs bursting adjacent to the southeast corner of the target area. No assessment of damage can be made.

#### Rheine M/Y - Fiar Results

Two concentrations of GP bombs can be seen bursting in and adjacent to central portion of M/Y immediately south of the goods depot. There were twelve hits on rail lines in the M/Y. Two large multi-bay factory buildings northwest of the multiple track railroad bridge received three direct hits. The southern-most building which had received two hits at the northwest corner is approximately ten percent damaged. Slight damage will result to residences in the southern part of town.

#### Castrop/Rauxel - Unobserved Results

10/10 solid cloud.

#### Bielefeld M/Y and Viaduct - Very Good Results

Viaduct appears to be well hit, remainder of bombs seen to be striking built up part of city.

#### Bielefeld M/Y - Good Results

Viaduct three miles north northeast of the city was also hit with very good results. No further details.
