SUBJECT: Lead Bombardier's Narrative, Ninety Fifth "A" Squadron, Mission of 5 December 1944, Berlin, Germany.

TO : Commanding Officer, 95th Bombardment Group (H), A.A.F.

1. Narrative.

- a. Bombing aids used were C-2, E-6-B and C-1 computers.
- b. Made a right hand turn on the briefed Initial Point.
- c. Bomb bay doors were opened after turning on Initial Point.
- d. High squadron took over on run as our mickey was out. Made bomb run stacked down to right of high squadron. Bombs were away at 1050 hours. Cloud coverage was 10/10ths. Flak was light and acc.
- e. Bombing results were unobserved.
- f. There are no changes to be made.
