95 "A" SQUADRON FORMATION

1. GENERAL NARRATIVE: The 95 "A" Squadron was leading the 13th Combat Wing, take off was 0655-0715 hours. Assembly was accomplished over BU #23 at 0815 hours. Wing assembly was at BU #28, but to avoid interference with 15 "B" Group on the assembly. Division assembly time was out short, but the Wing was assembled and the coast was departed on course and on time.

The whole bomber stream was drifting south of course and at a point approximately 0630 east the stream was about twenty miles south of the briefed route. At approximately this time the 4th "E" Group made a ninety degree turn to the left and turned back to the briefed course. This caused all of the following groups to do the same. The I.P. was made good, the bombing run was visual and a sharp right turn was made after bombs away in order to avoid the flak defenses of the southern part of the city. The turn off the target brought the squadron south of course, and the turn was made south and west of the R.P.

At approximately 0600 east on the route back the lead ship of "A" squadron aborted because of wounded personnel on board. The lead of the Wing was assumed by the "B" squadron leader and the return flight to base was as briefed. Landing was accomplished at 1400-1454 hours.

- 2. AIRCRAFT NOT ATTACKING: Ten A/C and one PFF were dispatched. Ten A/C and one PFF attacked the target. Ten A/C and one PFF were credited with sorties.
 - 3. AIRCRAFT LOST: None.

95 "B" SQUADRON FORMATION

- 1. GENERAL NARRATIVE: The 95 "B" squadron took off at 0701-0825 hours. Assembly was made over BU #25 at 0815 hours. Wing assembly was accomplished uneventfully. See General Narrative of "A" Squadron. The Wing leader aborted at about 0600 east on the way out. Lead was assumed by "B" Squadron leader, and the return to base was uneventful. Landing was 1414-1449 hours.
- 2. AIRCRAFT NOT ATTACKING: Eleven A/C and one PFF were dispatched. Eleven A/C and one PFF attacked the target. Eleven A/C and one PFF were credited with sorties.
 - 3. AIRCRAFT LOST: None.

95 "C" SQUADRON FORMATION 1. GENERAL NARRATIVE: Ninety Fifth "C" Squadron took off at 0657-0740 hours. Squadron assembly was completed at 0805 hours. The Squadron joined formation with the lead squadron. See the General Narrative of the "A" Squadron. After bombs were away a sharp turn was made to the right and enemy fighters attacked the formation. There were two attacks by waves of single engine fighters. The friendly fighter escort arrived after the second attack and dispersed the enemy fighters. "A" Squadron was out off on the turn at the R.P. and group assembly was made a short time later. The remainder of the flight was as written in the General Narrative. Landing was at 1417-1451 hours. Authority LAN 19500 DECLASSIFIED 2. AIRCRAFT NOT ATTACKING: Eight A/C and one PFF were dispatched. Eight A/C and one PFF attacked the target. Eight A/C and one PFF were credited with sorties. 3. AIRCRAFT LOST: A/C #6528 and A/C #7215 were lost to enemy fighter NOEL T. CUMBAA Major, Air Corps, Operations Officer.

1. Ten plus one PFF A/C from the 95th Group took off beginning at 0655 ours to form the lead squadron of the RSA Combat Group to attack oil targets n Hamburg, Germany.

Eleven plus one PFF A/C from the 95th Group took off beginning at 0701 ours to form the high squadron of the 13A Combat Group to attack oil targets

n Hanburg, Germany.

Eight plus one PFF A/C from the 95th Group took off beginning at 0657 ho urs to form the low squadron of the 13A Combat Group to attack oil targets in Hamburg, Germany. Three A/C from the 100th Group flew with this squadron. A/C No. 8776 aborted at 1105 hours at 5355-0815, because ball turret gummer was unconscious from anexia. A/C No. 6528 and No. 7215 were lost in action due to E/A

- 2. 950 squadron, flying in trail of 95A and 95B after bombs away, and not in combat group formation, was attacked. 5/7 FW-190s, including 1/2 possible Me-109s, attacked at 1155 hours at 5322-0931. Flying above and against the bomber s tream to a position of adventage between 950 and the sun, then swinging in a pursuit curve, they attacked abreast from 5 to 7 o'clock a little high and came in to 4/500 yards and broke off both right and left, and down. Filots were experienced and pressed home attacks. Twenty like were used, but several erews reported three additional FW-190s following immediately in the wake of the attack, staying out of range and firing rockets. E/A were dirty silver, brown, battleship gray, black, some had straight-lined crosses outlined in white, and one had a rod circular stripe around the fuselage. Two B-17s on fire, and two E/A down in this attack. At 1154 hours three FW-190s, possibly a repeat attack, came in from five o'clock and slightly low, pressing attack to 300 yards and then breaking away down. One E/A down. Claims 3-3-2. Ten to fifteen additional FW-190s were flying with the five to seven FW-190s against the bomber s tream and crows have no reports on them. At 1132 hours at 5404-0900, five minutes before the IP a dark colored T/E A/C circled above the formation. Crews did not believe this A/C a Mosquito.

4. 95A, B, and C squadrens bombed the primary target at Hamburg visually h that order. 95A bombs dropped short with some hits on the MPI. A large applosion occurred just west of the MPI. 95B squadron had a good pattern on and lightly over the MPI. Three fires seen in the target area. 95C bombs dropped ato the smake in the target area. All bombing considered very good.

hey were in position before leaving the coast. Division leader went south of purse and kept going further south, due to strong north wind. Started getting lak from Frisian Islands when formation was about 5350-0710. Turned due north o get back on course. Drifted a bit south of course again before briefed IP, ut made it good. Briefed course followed the rest of mission except A squadron wung a bit wide of RP and other two squadrons cut a bit short to close group formation. Crews report friendly fighters drawn to Lubeck area while on bomb run. Consequently there were only 3 friendly fighters observed covering this wing from target area to enemy coast on the route cut. One group of friendly fighters was reported coming into tail of formation in attack formation at enemy coast on route out. Closed in very close in a hostile manner and were fired on by our formation. The bombardier's in the lead ships of the A and C squadrons were injured by flak prior to the bombing but remained at the sight and dropped with very good results.

A/C No. 7215 was hit by E/A at 1155 just after bombs away. No. 3 engine was on fire. The plane went into a spiral but plane was under control. One chute was seen. A/C No. 6528 was hit at 1155 hours at 5330-0900. The right wing was on fire. Pilot tried to put out fire but failed. The A/C went into a flat spin, but was under control. Two chutes were seen. All other A/C

returned to base by 1454 hours.
